SAFETY TIPS

- Compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs) are fragile and contain mercury, so pack them carefully to prevent breakage.
- If packing more than one CFL use protective padding such as paper towels or newspaper. Do not place any other items in the same container.

IF A CFL BREAKS, FOLLOW THESE EPA GUIDELINES:

- Clear the area of people and pets, turn off the central air conditioning/heater, and open windows and doors to the outside to ventilate the room for at least 5-10 minutes.
- Wear rubber gloves and scoop up glass fragments and powder using stiff paper or cardboard – **don't vacuum**. Use tape to pick up remaining glass fragments and powder. Use a wet paper towel to clean hard surfaces. Place the bulb debris and cleanup materials in a plastic zipper bag, glass jar with metal lid, or other sealable container.
- Dispose at your local Household Hazardous Waste event. If you can't make it to an event right away, store in a protected area away from kids and pets.
