DID YOU KNOW?

Back to school is coming up! Did you know there are several ways to reduce waste at school? Here are some tips for you to get started!

- When you buy school supplies, look for ones that are made with recycled content. When you buy recycled, you create a demand for recycled products, which increases the likelihood that the materials that we put in our recycling bins will get recycled.
- Try packing zero waste lunches for your kids. You can save money and reduce waste by packing sandwiches and snacks in reusable containers instead of using throwaway plastic baggies. Instead of giving kids juice boxes and water bottles, fill a thermos or reusable bottle with juice or water.
- Before getting rid of electronics, see if they can be repaired. If you aren't sure how to do this yourself, try searching for a electronics repair shop near you to see if they can fix the problem with your device(s). If you have old electronic devices (E-waste) that aren't salvageable, you can bring them to the Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill during normal business hours free of charge.
- Have older kids going off to college? A zero-waste kit can help them reduce waste. What's in a zero-waste kit? Reusable versions of single-use plastic items that are typically found at college cafeterias! The perfect zero-waste kit includes a metal or bamboo fork, spoon and knife, a cloth napkin, a travel mug and a reusable water bottle. These zero-waste essentials are great for helping busy folks on the go reduce waste.
- Please remember to manage your dead batteries properly - do not place them in the trash. For more information about proper battery recycling including a list of where to pick up orange battery bags, please call 528-1103. Rechargeable batteries are a low waste, cost effective alternative to alkaline batteries.
