DID YOU KNOW?

Did you that some things are never supposed to go in your trash can or the recycling? Certain materials are toxic to the environment, pose a danger to sanitation workers and/or pose a fire hazard when disposed of improperly. The Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency offers many free programs to manage common hazardous materials:

- **Batteries:** GreenWaste of Tehama recipients: place alkaline batteries in an orange battery bag. Bags can be dropped off at the Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill seven days a week, or placed in your recycling bin. City of Corning residents: drop off your batteries at an all-battery box location. For a list of locations to pick up orange battery bags and a list of all-battery box locations, visit www.co.tehama.ca.us/government/departments/landfill-agency/toxics/batteries/.
 - **Fluorescents:** Fluorescent lightbulbs should be dropped off at a free CFL drop-off site in Tehama County. They should never go in the trash or recycling, as this poses a mercury exposure risk to solid waste employees and the environment.  - **Household hazardous waste:** Household hazardous waste or HHW is any waste that contains ingredients that are flammable, explosive, corrosive, or present a health or pollution hazard. The Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill and Corning Disposal accept HHW for free from residents on designated days throughout the year. Upcoming events for HHW collection near you are listed below.
 - **Electronic waste:** Electronic waste is accepted free of charge seven days a week at the Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill. Electronic waste contains heavy metals, so it should never go in the trash. Electronic waste collected in Tehama County is sent for recycling. This allows the valuable metals like copper, coltan and gold present in electronics to be used again.
